CATCHY COMMENTS

Some of the entries resided in the mailbox longer than usual, so therefore are more than a month old. At the end of March, **Reggie White** was catching some huge Brown Trout on fly in Tierra del fuego, Argentina.

Reggie had 20 and 21 pounders for 16 fly and 20 fly club records, with his highest point Brown being a 22-0 on 12 fly for 597 points. Quite a trip.

Rucker McDonald was fishing with his wife **Carol** on Tim's Ford Lake, Tennessee catching some Smallmouth Bass at the end of March. **Rucker's** entry is a 2-2 on 2# plug for 212 points.

Mickey Kodroff has turned in the largest Hickory of the year with a 2-8 on 4# spin for 238 points fishing on the James River fishing with **Ronnie Sides**. **Parks Rountrey** on fishing the Chick to take the specie lead on Bowfin. **Parks** landed a 6-8 on 4 general worth 198 points. It's obvious that **Elly's** pond still has some nice fish in it. **Robbie Robinson** was fly fishing a got a Shell Cracker on a popper worth 375 points on 2# for the Sunfish specie lead. **Rob Choi** was using his kayak on the James River and landed a nice 8-8 Gar on a Yum red worm on 4# spin for 231 points.

Last but not least, **Fred Cousins** is never out of the running and caught a 13-0 Gar on the Chick for 377 points. **Fred** is having a heck of a year and is leading six different species and four divisions.

With the hot temperatures and warmer water, the saltwater fishing is finally picking up. **Mickey Kodroff** has switched over to the salty water at Oregon Inlet and turned in a 8-0 Bluefish on 4# general for 160 points. **Eddy Johnston** also caught an 8-4

Bluefish at Rudee Inlet on 2# spin which earned him the specie lead with 275 points.

Tony Horsley and **Jamie Pitts** have had several successful fishing trips at the CBBT lately. In late May, **Tony** caught a 50-0 Black Drum on clam for 142 points and **Jamie** topped that catch with another Black Drum weighing 65-0 pounds for the specie lead. All caught on 20 pound line. Not to be out done, **Justin Pitts**, Jamie's son, caught a 27-0 Black Drum worth 90 points and has entered a "youth entry" for an 18-0 Striper on 8# general for 200 points. On the next trip to the bridge tunnel, **Tony** caught a Red Drum weighing 32 pounds on crab which earned him a Virginia Citation Release. **Jamie** again topped **Tony** with a 45-0 Red Drum on 20# general for 236 points which now takes another Drum specie lead.

Glenn Carter has just a few catches left to earn the prestigious Master Angler Rating. So **Stuart Lee** agreed to help **Glenn** and fish the "Point" off Oregon Inlet for his Dolphin on spin and Cobia on plug with each required to be worth a minimum of 150 points. The first day, Dolphin were caught with the smallest ones being quickest to the jig which still leaves **Glenn** 15 points short of his goal. He landed a 4-12 on 4# spin for 135 points. **Glenn** was successful and caught a 32-0 Cobia sight casting a bucktail on 8# plug for 355 points for one of his required entries. The next day, **Glenn** landed another Cobia weighing 37-0 on 12# plug for 246 points. On the third day, they decided to fish for Spotted Seatrout and now it was **Stuart's** turn. The trout fishing was slower than the day before, but **Stuart** did manage to catch his largest Speckle to date. It was a 7-0 on 6 spin for 260 points. Nice fish!

Upcoming Angling Events

Virginia Flounder

Sat thru Sun, June 21-22 (Blow date is June 28-29)

Flounder action has been spotty at best so far this spring – hampered by muddy water from all the wind and rain. However, flounder will be moving into their summer patterns by June and we have a tournament just in time to accommodate the serious flounder pounders itching to test their talents. Popular spots for large fish include the buoy 36 area and the Chesapeake Bay Bridge Tunnel. The tournament is open to all Virginia waters. We will recognize three places for heaviest weight fish and three places for highest point fish.

Location: All Virginia Waters

Awards: We will recognize three places for heaviest weight fish and three places for highest point fish.

First = 3 pts.
Second = 2 pts.
Third = 1 pt.

These points will apply towards the annual Tournament Angler of the Year competition.

Report in: Parks Rountrey within 5 days:

You can not change the entry category once you have registered it with the Chairman. You do not need to fill out cards.

Chairman: Parks Rountrey

First = 3 pts. Second = 2 pts. Third = 1 pt. These points will apply towards the annual Saltwater Tournament Angler of the Year competition. A fish can be entered by weight or points (angler must declare which category) but not both ways for 1 fish. One angler can win both weight and points divisions by entering 2 different fish. One angler can win 1st, 2nd and 3rd in both weight and points divisions by entering multiple fish. In addition we will have a \$10 per person “winner takes all” Calcutta for the heaviest flounder caught during the tournament. Contact Parks to get in the Calcutta.

NOTES: A fish can be entered by weight or points (angler must declare which category) but not both ways for 1 fish.

One angler can win both weight and points divisions by entering 2 different fish.

One angler can win 1st, 2nd and 3rd in both weight and points divisions by entering multiple fish.

Contact Chairman to confirm event if weather is questionable.

Traditional cup, \$40 Greentop gift certificate or a VAC Banquet ticket for the January 2009 Banquet.

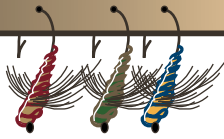
