LOCAL VCU FACULTY MEMBER APPOINTED TO MAFMC

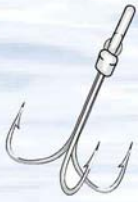

CATCHY COMMENTS

The summer fishing season has finally arrived! Over twenty entries have been turned in this month with saltwater taking the lead over freshwater.

Billy Nicar had a nice 22-0 Dolphin off Hatteras the 4th of June, but a few days later, the June 7th weekend was even better.

Jamie Pitts, his son **Justin**, and **Tony Horsley** were catching large Red Drum that weekend at the CBBT. **Jamie** caught a 43-0 pounder, **Justin** a 50-0 pounder and **Tony** a 58 pound Red Drum worth 305 points. **Tony** will take the Largest and Species leads for Red Drum. **Bernie Skydanek's** 59-0 Club Record on 20# is still intact! **Justin**, age 13, will take the lead for the Youth Award with 263 points. Great catch **Justin!** All the Drum were caught on 20 pound line using crab for bait.



Billy Nicar followed up the month on freshwater with some high point catches. **Billy** had a 6-2 pound Largemouth Bass from Lake Prince on 4# spin worth 306 points and the Species lead. The first of July, **he** caught Rainbow Trout at Cedar Springs taking several Club Records. **Billy's** fly entry was a 4-8 on 4# fly worth 255 points. **His** Club Record entries were a 4-14 on 4# spin and a 4-2 on 6# general for the Rainbow's.

Visiting Marathon, Florida the following weekend, **Quinton** and **Billy Corbett** released several large Tarpon for the non-local category. **Quinton's** fish was estimated at 85 pounds and **Billy's** at 125 pounds. They were both caught with a crab on 20# general and will be worth 150 points using the release basic weight of 45 pounds.

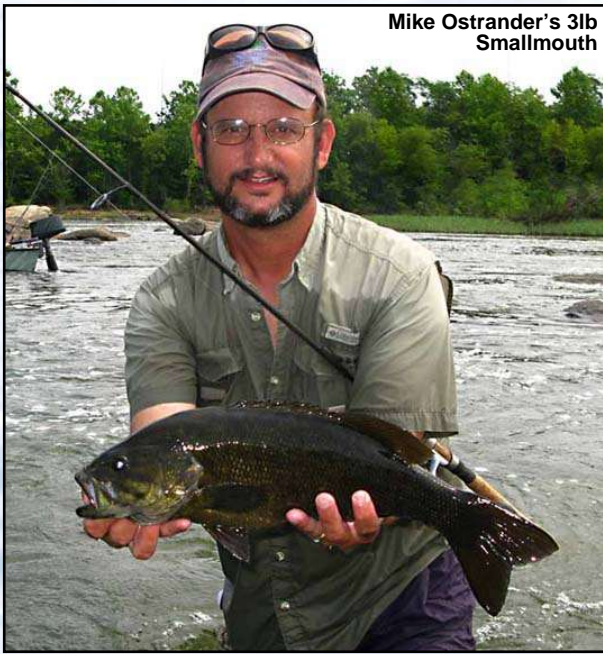
Wilson Nobles and **Larry Allen** were fishing the mouth of the York River on June 13th. **Wilson** caught a 60-4 pound Cobia and weighed it at "Fish-On Tackle" in Deltaville. **Wilson's** Cobia was caught using an eel and will take the Species and Largest leads for the year. Neither **Larry** nor **Wilson** turn in many fish each year unless they are BIG!

Fishing the surf at Hatteras Inlet, **Hunter Wells** turned in a Spanish Mackerel caught on a Stingsilver. The fish weighed 2-1 and was worth 103 points. This Spanish will take the Species, Largest, Surf Division leads, and is also a Club Record. That's getting the most "bang for the buck" for a single entry! Recently, **Danny Noland**, **Ryan Noland**, **Jeff Doughty**, **Dean Winstead**, and **myself** fished the 4A Drydocks and Tiger Wrecks for Spadefish several times. **Jeff** had a 3-12 on 4# using a clam for 162 points. **Ryan** had the largest Spadefish which was 7-6 on 6# general. **I** caught the highest point entry which was a 6-12 on 4# general for 270 points. **We** are seeing the larger fish on the Tiger, but they are still managing to elude us. During the last several weeks, **we** tagged and released over thirty Spadefish.

That same weekend, **Mickey Kodroff** and **Jim Sheffield** were fishing the deep water off Oregon Inlet and landed several fish. **Mickey** entered a 24 pound Amberjack on 12 fly using a **Gallasch** popper. **Bill's** poppers have fooled many an Amberjack over the years. **Mickey's** fish will lead the Saltwater Fly Division and also the Largest of Species. Later that afternoon, **Mickey** also landed a Club Record Blueline Tilefish on 40# braid which will be entered in the new 50# Braid category.

Scott Johnston, "the elder", has been fishing the Piankatank River recently with **George Atkinson**. **Scott** has caught a nice 1-3 Croaker on 6# fly for 133 points. I'm sure the Clouser was hand tied by **Scott**, himself!

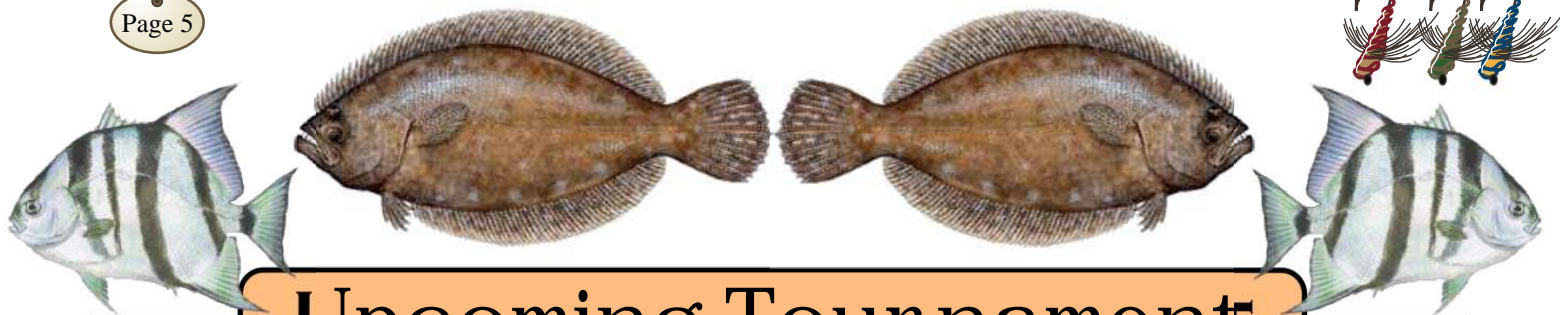
Last but not least, **Matt Balazik** has been pounding the waters of the Chickahominy River lately. **Matt** caught a 1-9 Chain Pickerel on 2# spin, a 0-8 Sunfish on 2# fly, and his best entry being a 2-4 Largemouth Bass on 2# fly worth 187 points using a topwater popper. Nice variety!

Upcoming Tournament

Virginia Flounder & Spadefish August 1-2 (Blow Date August 8-9)

Jumbo flounder action will peak in mid summer and we have a tournament just in time to accommodate the serious flounder pounders. Popular spots for large summer flounder include the buoy 36 area and the Chesapeake Bay Bridge Tunnel. To make things more interesting we have added spadefish as a second species this year. The spades will be oriented to structure and most people use small pieces of fresh clam for bait. The tournament is open to all Virginia waters.

We will recognize three places for heaviest weight fish and three places for highest point fish. First = 3 pts. Second = 2 pts. Third = 1 pt. These points will apply towards the annual Saltwater Tournament Angler of the Year competition.

A fish can be entered by weight or points (angler must declare which category) but not both ways for 1 fish. One angler can enter up to two fish of each species so that makes a potential of 4 entries for this 2 species event. It is possible to win both weight and points divisions by entering 2 different fish of each species.

Call in entries within 24 hours from end of tournament to Angling Activities Chairman Parks Rountrey 804-349-6001. You can not change the entry category once you have registered it with the Chairman.

You do not need to fill out cards. Tournament First Place Awards for weight and points = Anglers Choice; Traditional cup, \$40 Greenop gift certificate or a VAC Banquet ticket. Contact Chairman to confirm event if weather is questionable.

VAC WEBSITE FORUMS – DISCUSSION AT JULY MEMBERSHIP MEETING

Some questions of the current visibility of two Forums on the VAC Website were discussed by the VAC Leadership Team. The Team is seeking opinions of Members about the current visibility and if changes are felt to be needed. President Vic Skakandy will collect your opinions and ideas at the July Membership Meeting.

Fishing Reports:

The Fishing Forum is visible to anyone who logs onto www.virginiaanglersclub.com. Any fishing information posted, therefore, becomes “public knowledge” and can be used by anyone logged on. There is some feeling that information about where the action is hot, etc. should stay within the VAC and, therefore, be kept in the Members (only) section of the Website. For instance, if a member posts some specific location information about a specific bite, is there the possibility that a lot of non-members may show up at the hot spot and cause it to be crowded to the point that it is unfishable. Where do you come out on this question? Should the Fishing Forum be open to VAC Members only for posting and for reading? Maybe there is a way to post catch information to show the club is an active angling club while protecting the other related information that may best left to Member’s eyes only.

For Sale Forum:

The Forums section of the VAC Website has a For Sale Forum on which items for sale can be posted. The For Sale Forum is currently visible only to members who have set up a Forum Account. When an account holder clicks on “Forums”, the For Sale Forum comes up in the list of Forums. The question arose should items for sale be visible to the public? Should the public be able to post items for sale? Are the best interests of Members served by having the For Sale section of Forums only available to Members for posting items for sale and for contacting the seller about the item?

Postings in the Forums Section:

All forums require a pre-approved account to post messages. Currently only VAC members are approved for forum accounts. Should we allow non-members the ability to obtain a forum account and post comments? Is the possibility of posting of comments contrary or damaging to the mission of the VAC a significant enough possibility that posting should be limited to account holders?

Please think about these questions. Maybe you have opinions of other changes that need to be made in the Forums section of the VAC Website. The Leadership Team wants the features of the website to be set up to best serve the needs of the VAC and the interests of the Membership. Vic will spend a few minutes seeking Forums related opinions at the June Membership Meeting. Thanks in advance for your helping the Leadership Team.

HOW TO: POSTING IN THE FORUMS

Starting a New Topic

Browse to the board where you wish to post and click the New Topic button (positioned by default at both the top and the bottom of the board, as shown in the User Help Introduction), which should take you to the Start new topic screen. While this presents a number of options, the two most important are the Subject field and main Message field (not labeled as such, but obvious by its size).

So enter your subject and start to type (or paste) your message into the main text area, noting that a message missing either a subject or a body will not be accepted for posting until it has both. If you're happy with your plain text message, you can then post it by clicking the Post button and/or preview it first by clicking the Preview button, but there are many further options available to make things that little bit more interesting.

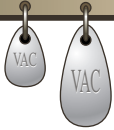
