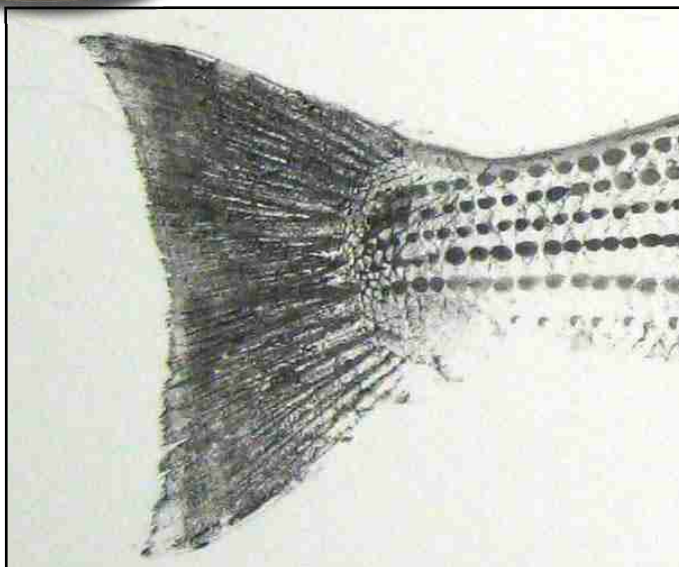

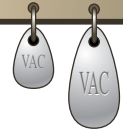
### "JET SKI BRIAN" WRAPS UP 2010 PROGRAM OFFERINGS

**CATCHY COMMENTS**

With the 2010 fishing year over and all the entry cards postmarked by December 10<sup>th</sup>, the Rules Committee can now start assembling all the entries for the Awards Banquet on January 22, 2011, at Sam Millers Restaurant.

There were several nice entries for November. **Fred Cousins** started out the beginning of the month with a 2 pound 11 ounce Chain Pickerel from Lee Hall Reservoir. The fish is worth 268 points on 2# spin using a spinnerbait. The Pickerel will now take both the "specie" and "heaviest" leads.

**Parks Rountrey** spent several days the next week on the James River Crappie fishing. His best catch was a 1 pound 3 ounce Crappie on 2# plug for 188 points on a plastic grub. November 12<sup>th</sup>, **Parks'** fishing partner, **Bob Brown**, went to Chippoke's Creek and landed a huge Gar on 2# general worth 465 points using a minnow for bait. Not to be out fished, **Parks** went back to Chippoke's on November 22<sup>nd</sup>, and caught another 16 pound Gar on 2# plug valued at 581 points using a Jerk Shad for bait. This fish will score the freshwater "plug division" and also the "species" leads. **Bob** will maintain the "heaviest" lead for Gar because of the earlier entry.

Talking to **Billy Nicar**, several Greentop employees went to Sugar Grove, West Virginia fly fishing for trout. **Billy's** best fish was a 2 pound 5 ounce Brook Trout on 2# fly worth 230 points. The Brookie will now lead the "specie" and "heaviest" categories.

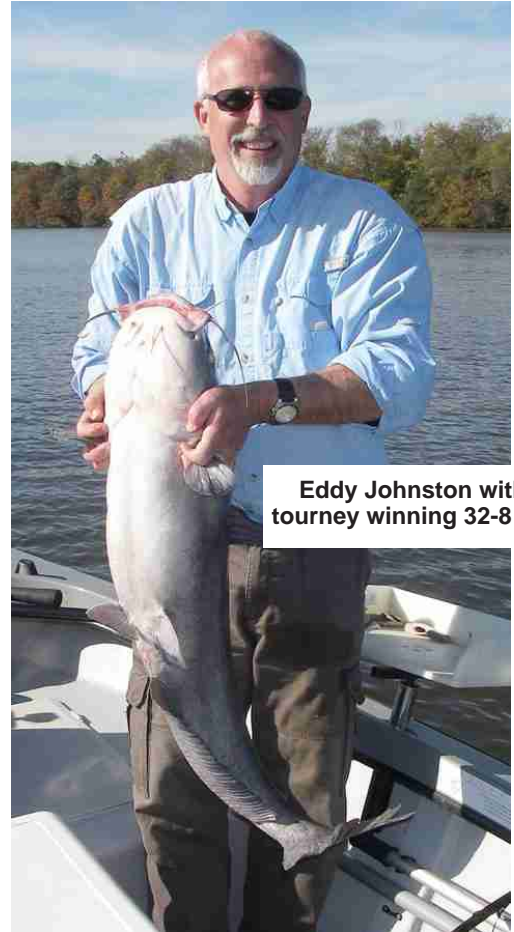
**Matt Balazik** entered fish in both the freshwater and saltwater divisions. **Matt's** freshwater entry was a 25 pound Blue Catfish on 4# general worth 266 points from the James River. Fishing on Cobham Bay the following day, **Matt** landed a nice 3 pound 8 ounce Spotted Seatrout on 2# spin worth 233 points on a green jig. Both good entries!

Final entry of 2010 was for an 11 pound 8 ounce Bluefish by **Bruce Henderson**. **Bruce** and his friend, **Bob Jamerson**, were fishing the Triangle Wreck area off Virginia Beach on November 29<sup>th</sup> where he landed the 191 point fish on 8# plug. The Bluefish will take both the "species" and "heaviest" leads.

This will be the final newsletter for this year and I hope to see you at the Awards Banquet at Sam Miller's!

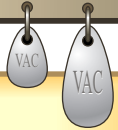

**NATIONAL SALTWATER ANGER REGISTRY CLARIFIED – NEW FOR 2011**

From the NOAA Marine Recreational Identity Program Home Page (<https://www.countmyfish.noaa.gov/>)

Starting January 1, 2011, if you have a saltwater recreational fishing license or registration from any state or U.S. territory EXCEPT Hawaii, New Jersey, Puerto Rico, and the U.S. Virgin Islands, you are AUTOMATICALLY registered and do not need to take further action. The fee for registering beginning January 1, 2011 is \$15 for most people.

**BOAT RAMP AT CHESAPEAKE YACHT – PERMIT NEEDED FOR ACCESS**

Numbered Ramp Use Permits can be obtained by calling Kymberly Taylor, VP of Chesapeake Yacht, Inc. at (757)-487-9100. .

When you make your permit request call to Kymberly Taylor, please have the below personal and vehicle information ready to give her. Kymberly will send you a numbered permit that you will need to display in the window of your tow vehicle while on the property. Also, your permit number must appear on the envelope in which you put your ramp fee payment.

Personal Information: Full Name, Mailing Address, Cell Phone Number

Tow Vehicle Information: Make, Model, Year, Color and License Number

As an alternative to calling Kymberly for a numbered ramp access permit, the request for a ramp permit and the needed information can be sent via e-mail to or faxed to (757)-489-9134. If you want to pick up your permit on site at Chesapeake Yacht, Inc., Kymberly can arrange for that too.

Chesapeake Yacht, Inc. provides permitted access to their launch ramp as a public service. The ramp use fees do not cover the annual expense of maintaining the ramp and trailer parking area, renting the portable toilet and contracting for dumpster service. Please deposit your litter in the dumpster provided. If some other user has left their trash behind, take a minute to collect that and put it in the dumpster along with yours.

## How to Avoid the Six (6) Most Common Boat Winterizing Mistakes

With winter approaching, BoatUS. Marine Insurance has reviewed its claim files and reports the following six most common mistakes made when winterizing a boat:

**1. Failure to winterize the engine:** Freezing temperatures occur in all 50 states and while they are taken seriously up north, it's the balmy states of California, Florida, Texas, Alabama, and Georgia where boaters are most likely to have freeze-related damage to engine blocks. It routinely occurs to boats stored ashore here. Boats left in a slip are less susceptible to sudden freezing as the surrounding water retains heat longer than air.

**2. Failure to drain water from sea strainer:** If your winterizing plan calls for draining the engine, the seawater strainer must be winterized or residual water could freeze and rupture the watertight seal. Sometimes you won't know it's damaged until spring launching and water begins to trickle in.

**3. Failure to close seacocks:** For boats left in the water, leaving seacocks open over the winter is like going on extended vacation without locking the house. If a thru-hull cannot be closed, the vessel must be stored ashore - the sole exception is cockpit drains. Heavy snow loads can also force your boat under, allowing water to enter thru-hulls that are normally well above the water line.

**4. Clogged petcocks:** Engine cooling system petcocks clogged by rust or other debris can prevent water from fully draining. If one is plugged, try using a coat hanger to clear the blockage or use the engine's intake hose to flush anti-freeze through the system.

**5. Leaving open boats in the water over winter:** Boats with large open cockpits or low freeboard can easily be pushed underwater by the weight of accumulated ice and snow. Always store them ashore.

**6. Using biminis or dodgers as winter storage covers:** A cover that protects the crew from the sun does a lousy job protecting the boat from freezing rain and snow. Unlike a bona fide winter cover, biminis, and dodgers tend to rip apart and age prematurely by the effects of winter weather.

# Tournament News

## Elizabeth River VA Speckled Trout & Red Drum\* January 8-9 (blow date Jan. 15-16) Note: No fishing inside private hot ditch.

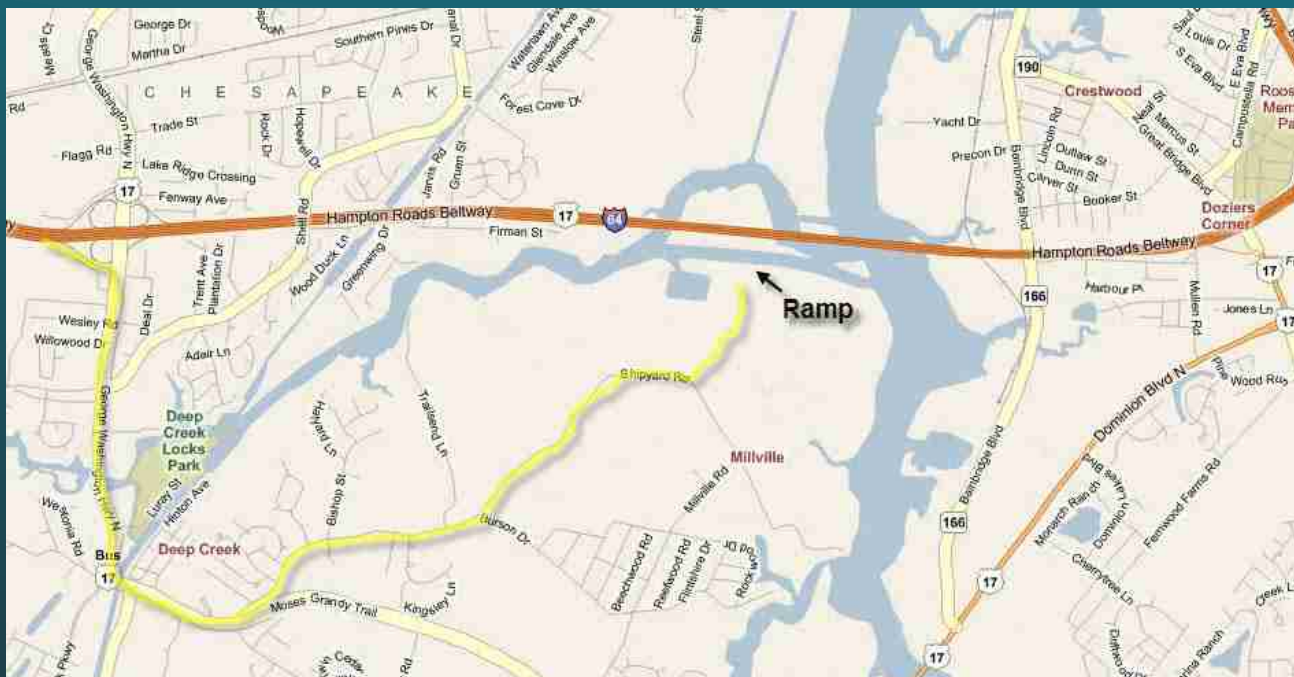
Our tourney will be at a peak time for big winter spotted sea trout on the Elizabeth River. This is a two species event including red drum – so it's like two tournaments at the same time. Tournament headquarters will be at the Chesapeake Yacht Ramp (\$10 fee – honor box at ramp plus ramp user registration required), 1700 Shipyard Road in Chesapeake VA. (see map). For a ramp permit contact Kim 757-487-9100. These fish can be caught on all the same artificials used in other areas, but floating live baits under corks or slow trolling are arguably the most productive methods for the heaviest trout. For light tackle points - various soft plastic baits and mirro-lures are effective on light spinning and plug gear. This launch is very easy to get to and fish in any trailerable boat or even kayaks. If you have not tried it before, be sure to plan on fishing and learning with us. Contact Chairman to confirm event if weather is questionable.

Two ways to win! We will recognize three places for heaviest weight fish and three places for highest point fish for each species.

First = 3 pts. Second = 2 pts. Third = 1 pt.

These points will apply towards the annual Salt Water Tournament Angler of the Year competition. A fish can be entered by weight or points (angler must declare which category) but not both ways for 1 fish. Only 2 fish of each species can be entered per person.

### Basic Fly Fishing Workshop in Chesapeake January 8 and February 5

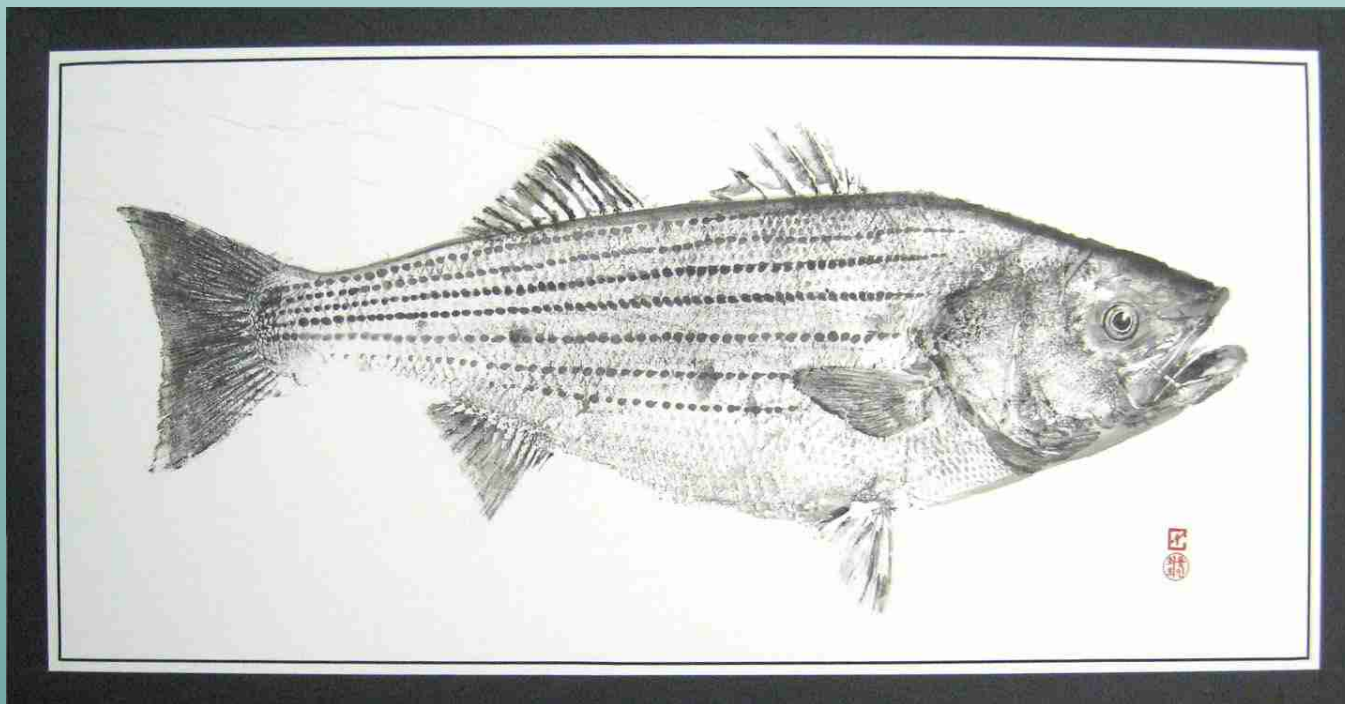

**\*Gyotaku** (Japanese, from gyo "fish" + taku "rubbing") is a traditional form of Japanese fish printing, dating from the mid 1800s, a form of nature printing used by fishermen to record their catches. In order to make a gyotaku print, one places the subject (e.g. fish, crab, scallop shell) on a wooden bench and paints one side with sumi ink. Modern gyotaku artists often substitute acrylic or other painting material for the traditional sumi. (Source - From
