## President's Message

December 2020

From the entire leadership team, we hope everyone is healthy, safe and looking forward to the Holidays ... and pretty important stuff here ... getting some fishing time in. With the hopes of gathering once again and fishing together, combined with a few goals, good ideas and hard work putting these into action, our membership and club has a great outlook for 2021.

We are now in the new angling year for the VAC, and leadership team is busy like Santa's elves building toys and arranging excellent programs, expeditions and opportunities for members to achieve an angler rating or two. Well, maybe not building toys, but building a great future for the VAC.

A major benefit of being a Virginia Anglers Club member is access to the Catch Database. Spanning six decades now, the amount of fishing information is vast, and the work Johnny Wetlaufer did years ago (bringing the database into the digital world) gives members an encyclopedia of catch data with the click of a couple buttons. Not fishing data, but CATCH data!

One of the goals for 2021 is to increase the number of card submissions and by doing so, we embrace our history of recording catches, achieve angler ratings, and continue to build the Catch Database. It all started July 1, 1960 when Lewis Pendleton caught and entered a 7-0 largemouth bass on 12-spin. Today, there are 12,603 entries!

Over the past ten years, our club's card submissions have dropped off steeply. According to Stuart Lee, a big part of this drop off has been the club's shift away from saltwater fishing and becoming more of a freshwater club. In the 1980's, 1990's and early 2000's, the club had a lot of members who fished saltwater nearly every weekend and more than 350 cards were submitted each year for nearly three decades. In 1996 and 1997, the club had 494 and 492 cards entered, which seems to be a peak and, perhaps, something to shoot for over time.

Over the past decade, we have averaged about 135 submissions per year. In 2020, 159 cards were submitted ... far off the high counts of the 1980's, 1990's and early 2000's. We can do better ... we must do better. This brings me back to the point of the goal for 2021 and the historical importance of increasing the amount of card submissions. Certainly, we can each make a concentrated effort to weigh our fish, submit our cards and go for over 200 this year, and see how far beyond 200 we can achieve.

In 2020, we had an outstanding year gaining ten wonderful new members, and 2021 should hopefully lead to the same outcome. Our Zoom meetings are working, but it does not compare to meeting in person. While we work towards that moment of meeting in person, we'll do everything we can to increase participation in the monthly meetings, and that, of course, begins with having quality speakers and presentations. Other than two more muskie rods (and reels), these goals are the only things on my Christmas wish list. With all the people working towards them, I'm very much looking forward to the upcoming year. Thanks, enjoy the Holidays and good luck fishing!!

December 9, 2020: On December 8th, the Commission adjusted the 2021-2023 recreational cobia management measures to comply with the ASMFC Cobia Fishery Management Plan. The new management measures are: a season of June 15-September 15; a 1 fish per person, 2 fish per vessel possession limit; and a prohibition on gaffing. The minimum size of 40" total length with one allowed on a vessel >50" total length remains the same. The 2021 Recreational Cobia Permit for Virginia will be available online on January 1, 2021.



# ENDANGERED “DINOSAUR FISH” WASHES UP IN VIRGINIA BEACH

November 17, 2020

Something more than seaweed has been washing up in Virginia Beach. This endangered Atlantic sturgeon, a prehistoric fish that can grow up to 14 feet long, caused a stir when it was found on the beach Sunday.

Matt Lillis snapped a photo of the dinosaur-like creature at 20th Street, and it was later shared on the Virginia Wildlife Facebook page. Lillis hadn't seen anything like it before and wondered what it was.

Dr. Matthew Balazik knew exactly what it was. “Likely about a 1.6-meter fork length male,” he tells Bay Bulletin. Dr. Balazik leads the Virginia Sturgeon Restoration Team at the VCU Rice Rivers Center. He got several reports of this same sturgeon washed up on the beach.

While it was a marvel to those who stumbled upon it, Dr. Balazik says it's typical to find dead sturgeon this time of year, and he's had reports of multiple carcasses in the past few days.

“Unfortunately, this is common as we find dozens each year and there are likely a bunch that are never reported,” says Dr. Balazik. He says the cause of death is probably boat strikes. That's because a large number of fall spawning sturgeon are leaving the rivers to return to the ocean. “The more fish you have moving, the more likely some are going to get chopped up...The fish are likely getting pulled into the propellers.”

Dr. Balazik notes that there has been a high number of reports in the Ocean View area of Norfolk, but the reason isn't clear. “It might be that the area has a lot of people around so the carcasses get seen and reported, or a high proportion of fish killed in this area—hard to tell for sure with that data we have.”

The Rice Rivers Center Sturgeon Team asks anyone who comes across a sturgeon carcass to report it.

“Like every year when the water temps get to about 18C in the lower James, most of the fall adult sturgeon have left. Unfortunately, this is when a lot of adults are killed by ship propellers. This year seems to be no different as a lot of you are reporting dead sturgeon and providing great pictures and location information. It's not a pleasant thing to do but we really appreciate all your efforts,” the team writes in a post.

## **2021 VAC ANGLING RULE CHANGES**

The Angling Rules Committee presented the new rule changes to the Board of Directors on 10/13/2020. The rule changes are based on input from VAC club members. The BOD has approved the rule changes and they will go into effect beginning with the 2021 angling year.

- Add kingfish (sea mullet, roundheads) to the list of saltwater species.
- Modify the length for shark release from 6' to 5' (fork length) to receive a release basic weight of 60 lbs.
- Reduce the basic weights for snakeheads.
- Reduce the basic weights for spotted seatrout.
- Modify the wording for the Youth Award to include the restriction that it applies to only non-club youth. See the following:

“Trophies will be awarded at the end of each angling year to any youth (non-club members), under age 18, fishing with a club member . . . “
