Ever come home and wonder why you went on vacation? On return, you find a double workload and foot high grass to cut. I guess that's why I always liked to take mine a day or two at a time.

Well, my recent absence was certainly no vacation, but the result was the same. In this issue, I will try to catch up on club news since early March. By the way, it is good to be back with old

friends and fishing again. I have gladly said good-bye to all of the new friends I made last month (Milk of Magnesia, Citrucel, Baby Wipes, Maxi-Pads, Depends and, of course, “the bag”)! Again, I thank everyone for your support during my “vacation”.

Our March Angler of the Month was **Scott Davis**. Scott set a club record with a beautiful 3-12 smallmouth on 2-plug that scored 375 points. Second place honors went to **Fred Cousins** for a 1-12 rainbow trout on 2-fly worth 233 points.

The April Angler of the Month was won by **Bob Brown** with a 26-0 blue catfish caught on 2-spin. Bob’s cat, which I guess was supposed to be a white perch, scored 400 points! **Robbie Robinson** took second place with a nice 4-10 American shad on 2-spin worth 370 points. **Eddy Johnston** was third with a 1-1 white perch on 2-fly that scored 354 points. Congratulations to all!

Nearly all of the action since March has been on the freshwater side. **Bill Ross** improved his club records for hybrid striped bass on 8-spin (5-0) and 12-spin (5-15). Bill’s fish were caught from the Haw River, NC. The hickory shad and white perch runs generated a lot of club interest, but very few entries. **Buddy Noland** set a club record with a 0-12 white perch on 2-plug. My 2-6 hickory shad on 2-fly caught in late March leads the list at 339 points. Larger hickories were caught by **Robbie Robinson** (2-11 on 2-spin) and **Fred Murray** (2-9 on 4-fly).

This has been a good year for chain pickerel! **Dean Winstead** has notched a club record for his 4-3 chain pickerel on 12-plug. Dean caught it at Kerr Lake. It was the fourth entry over four pounds this year.

Several members have plied the Nottoway for American shad this season. **Buddy and Danny Noland** scored early (March 14th). **Robbie Robinson** made several trips in March and April and leads with his nice 4-10 on 2-spin. I managed a couple of trips at the end of April and came away with a club record 4-3 on 2-plug. Some shad will remain in the river through the month of May.

Our trout tournament on Dunlop Creek generated nine brook trout entries and thirteen rainbow entries. Though none were monsters, a lot of trout were caught on fly. The tournament was enjoyed by all who attended. The top brookie, a 1-9 on 2-fly, was caught and released by **Ricky Dale**. **Danny Noland** released the best rainbow, a 2-6 on 2-fly, edging **David English** by one ounce.

Spring saltwater action is just getting started. **Buddy Noland** made our first flounder entry for the year with a nice 3-12 on 2-spin that scored 300 points. Buddy caught his fish off Cape Charles. **Dr. Jim Wright** caught a 4-9 speckled trout on 4-general at the hot ditch in early March. **Scott Johnston** has the first croaker entry for a 1-14 on 16-fly. Scott’s croaker sets a

club record and was caught on the Piankatank. **Rich McDaniel** made a trip to the Bahamas in April for bonefish. He released a 4-10 bonefish on 8-fly. Red drum are hitting in the Eastern Shore surf. I have managed two days of fishing so far that yielded seven nice drum ranging from 35-0 to 50-0. Five of the seven drum were 40 pounds or better.

DONAHUE EARNS FRESHWATER EXPERT

Gary Donahue is the club’s fifteenth member to earn the Freshwater Expert rating. Gary’s entries include several noteworthy catches beginning in 1991 with a club record 2-14 crappie on 2-fly. Several of his entries came from distant waters such as Tennessee, Canada and Michigan. Other catches include an 8-12 walleye on 4-spin, a 6-0 lake trout on 4-spin, a 5-8 largemouth bass on 4-general, a 7-6 striped bass on 4-general, a 12-0 northern pike on 4-spin, a 4-12 brown trout on 2-fly and a 31-8 Chinook salmon on 16-general. Congratulations to Gary!

GOOD NEWS – BAD NEWS

First, the good news. In late March, **Rich McDaniel** went after blue cats with his buddy Jim. They had a bang-up day! At one point, there were several fish hooked at one time. Rich described it as a real cluster-___! The good news fish was a 59-0, which Rich fought on 8-pound test!! The big cat put up quite a fight until it became entangled in another line that they had been unable to clear. Eventually the huge cat got untangled and was landed.

Now, the bad news. Due to the circumstances, Rich asked if the catch would be legal considering the entanglement that occurred accidentally. Sadly, I had to inform Rich that the entry could not be accepted. IGFA rules specifically disqualify any fish that is hooked or entangled on more than one line.

What an unfortunate set of circumstances. The catch would have been the largest blue catfish in club history not to mention a club record on 8-general. It was ever so close to that magical 60-pound plateau. For those of us that commonly fish multiple baits for many species, this is a reminder that lines need to be cleared quickly to avoid such a predicament. In Rich’s case, there was just no time to do so. When fishing multiple lines, the usual concern is that the lines themselves will tangle. This could cause a nice fish to get cut off by the line or at least a big mess to deal with after the fish is landed. Since you give up your ability to control large fish when you fish light line, the number of lines that can be deployed without creating such havoc should be carefully considered.

Rich’s honesty in this matter is highly commendable. I only wish the outcome could have been different. Considering the abundance of big blue catfish in the James and Rich’s angling skills, I think he will have another chance!

Tickets will be sold at the meeting for \$5.00 a chance or 5 chances for \$10.00. Drawing will be at the May 25th membership meeting after the break.

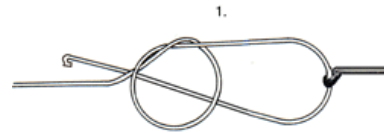

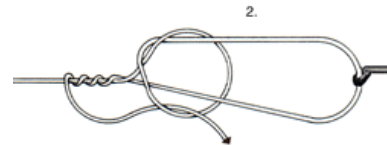
Tackle Tips - Non Slip Mono Loop Knot

The Non-Slip Mono Loop Knot is extremely strong and as the name says, does not slip like some of the other loop knots. Used with mono or leader, this knot allows more natural lure and hook action than knots that slide tight against the eye. This knot has been tested to close to 100% of the line strength. It is very important that you follow the wrap counts for maximizing its strength. 8X to 6lb test: 7 wraps. 8 to 12lbs: 5 wraps. 15lb to 40lb test: 4 wraps. 50-60lb test: 3 wraps, and up to 120lb test: 2 wraps.

Step 1. Take your line and form an over-hand knot, leaving approximately 8 inches. Pass the tag end through the eye of the hook. Bring the line back through the overhand knot the same side it came out. Make your wraps based upon the numbers above.



Step 2. After all the wraps are completed pass the line back through the over hand knot the same way it came out in the last step.



Step 3. Moisten the knot with your mouth, and while holding the hook in your right-hand pull slowly. As the knot tightens, take the standing line in your left hand and pull your hands apart finishing the knot. Finally, trim the ends.

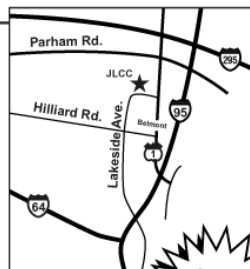
