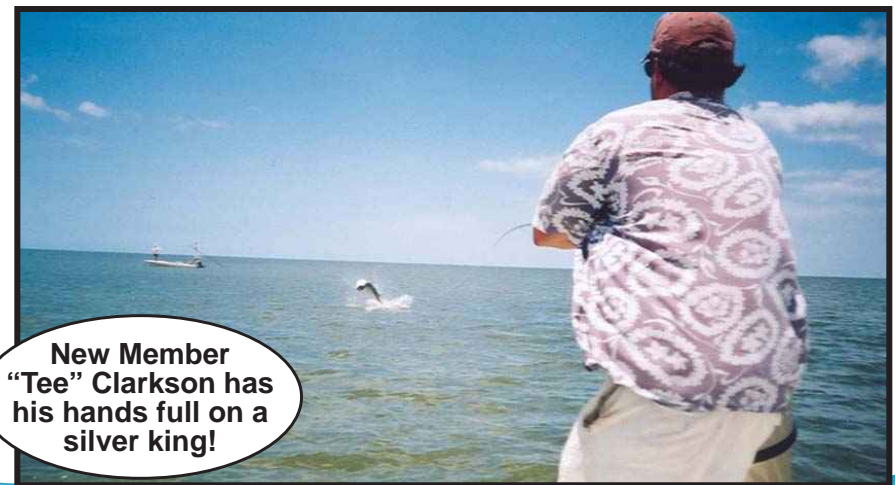

July Speaker Bill DuVal - Angler for 65 years!

Virginia Angler Club member Bill DuVal will speak at the July Membership Meeting on the history of the VAC and give his “take” on the VAC of today vs. the VAC of years gone by. The meeting will be a rare opportunity to hear from an angler who has been a member of the club since it was founded 43 years ago. Although Bill is not among the actual founding members, he is one of the 4 remaining anglers who joined the Virginia Anglers Club in it’s year of founding, 1961. Bill started fishing at the age of 3. He fished in the DuVal pond that still exists in Fox Chappell just off River Road.

An uncle who, for health reasons, came to live for a while on the poultry farm on which Bill grew up, locked in Bill’s real love of fishing. Ten year old Bill and Bill’s uncle went fishing about every day during the uncle’s 18 month’s residence on the farm. The uncle went on to prosper in the insurance business and made it a point to include Bill in fishing trips on rivers and various ponds in eastern Virginia as well trips from the uncle’s cottage on the Rappahannock River.

In 1960, Bill moved into a home that backed up to the home of a man named Hansford Tollifield DuVal. It turned out that Hansford and Bill were distant cousins who shared a love of fishing. A great friendship came of the common interest. Hansford asked Bill to join the VAC. Since joining the Virginia Anglers Club in 1961, Bill has continually maintained his membership, has caught many club records and has generously shared his love of fishing and knowledge with club members.

Bill was “adopted” by Joe Brooks, the outdoor writer and sportsman, who was the founding member of the Virginia Angler’s Club who first suggested that such a club be formed in the Richmond Area. As Joe’s physical ability to fish hard days dropped away, Bill would often be sent by Joe to fish in Joe’s place. Joe would often call Bill after an episode of Joe’s American Sportsman was aired on TV to see what Bill’s reaction to the show was. Joe introduced Bill to Ted Williams and guide George Hammel. Thru his friendship with George, Bill was introduced to fishing in many distant, exotic fishing locations.

Bill has been a long-time participant in many famous angling tournaments. One of note is the tournament held in Bermuda by the International Light Tackle Tournament Association.

Bill and fellow VAC member Pat Quisenberry first represented the VAC in the ILTTA’s annual tournament in Bermuda in 1967. Bill fished the tournament for 29 times.

To site recent success, Bill’s current team won the tournament in 2003 and missed first place this year because of a fish lost at gaffing with 2 minutes to go in the tournament. While in Bermuda this year, Bill got wind that some commercial fishermen were boating yellow tails in respectable numbers.

Bill came away from a charter taken on the ILTTA’s tournament rest day with 16 potential world records for yellow tails. Bill’s wife, Gene, and a girl friend of Gene’s also came away with a large number of potential world record catches.

Bill and his wife Gene have been generous and enthusiastic supporters of sport fishing and the Virginia Anglers Club. Bill and Gene devote a lot of time to the IGFA. Bill and Gene hold or have held a spectacular number of IGFA World Record Catches.

Gene is currently one of Virginia’s IGFA Representatives and is very active in a number of women’s angling clubs. She was the first woman in the world to pass the 100 mark for IGFA World Records. Bill and Gene generously supported an effort to get a group of Virginia anglers into a group affiliated with the CCA. Although this first effort faltered (thru no fault of the DuVals), CCA –VA eventually got rolling and has become one of the significant voices of the recreational angler in Virginia.

Bill generously shares his love of fishing with his family, grandchildren (one of whom he and Gene got fishing before the youngster was one year old) and friends. Our club is truly blessed to have a member like Bill for so long a time. Bill has indicated an interest in answering any questions he can, so please take a few minutes to things you might want to know about angling techniques, locations, “when they bite the best” information and what else you might want to learn about. The July Membership Meeting will be a rare opportunity to hear about our club from a member who has made angling history both locally and the world over.

CATCHY COMMENTS

Lots of saltwater action in early June to talk about! With Dupont's unleashing of the "Elly Monster" to wreak havoc on the rest of us, I expected as much. **Elly** and **Robbie Robinson** went after weakfish around the Concrete Ships and settled for a pair of 3-1 flounder. Elly's flounder was a club record on 2-plug and Robbie's was caught on 4-plug. A few days later they found a school of hungry black drum at the CBBT's third island. Robbie had the top rod, releasing a 74-0 monster on 8-plug that scored a whopping 592 points! He also picked up the fly rod and notched a 40-0 release on 12-fly! Elly had to settle with an 18-0 on 6-plug. Their assault on all things saltwater came to an untimely end with engine problems aboard the "Hokie". But, have no fear; the "Noland Gang" was there to pick up the slack!

Buddy and **Danny Noland**, **Ricky Dale** and protégés **Dean Winstead** and **Jeff Doughty** made several noteworthy early June trips. They scored with black sea bass at the Triangle Wrecks, with several over 3 pounds. **Ricky Dale** had the largest, a 4-9 on 6-plug. Buddy had the top score with his 3-12 on 2-plug that scored 331 points. The gang also set three new spadefish records. **Dean Winstead** took over the 20-general record with an 8-13 caught at the Deltaville range light. **Jeff Doughty** caught an 8-11 on 6-general at the Chesapeake Light Tower for his first club record! Jeff's spade is also a potential IGFA record on 6-pound line!! Nice way to break in a new Calcutta, Jeff! Ricky scored with a club record 7-11 on 16-fly at the light tower. They also found triggerfish at the "A" buoy, with Buddy releasing a 2-2 on 2-general and Danny releasing a 2-8 on 4-fly.

Later, in July, Buddy, Dean and Ricky tried the Fingers area for yellowfin tuna. The action was pretty good, with four tuna landed and several more striking and/or broke off. Dean landed the most, but Buddy had the best, which was a 38-0 yellowfin on 12-general scoring 237 points. **Dr. Jim Wright** was also in on the June action, with a pair of amberjack releases, a cobia release and five yellowfin releases on heavy tackle. **Gary Donahue**

caught the biggest croaker of the year (a 3-2 on 4-general) at the Target Ships.

In non-local waters, **Bill DuVal** released a pair of striped marlin at Cabo San Lucas, Mexico. New member **Bill Carter** released a trio of tarpon at Goodland, Florida. Using length/girth formulas, Bill's tarpon were estimated at 90, 120 and 158 pounds!

Surf action on the Eastern Shore picked up in the middle of June, with some larger fish and higher numbers. **LeRoy Houser** released a 32-0 and a 36-0. **Dennis Cline** released eight red drum exceeding 30 pounds, topped by a 47-0, and a blacktip shark that weighed 50-0. Two large drum (54-0 and 56-0) were also released by a non-member guest!

June's Angler of the Month award went to **Robbie Robinson** for his 74-0 black drum on 8-plug that scored 592 points. Second place honors went to **Scott Davis** for his 51-0 cobia on 8-plug that scored 566 points. **Dennis Cline** took third with a 51-0 cobia on 12-plug that scored 340 points.

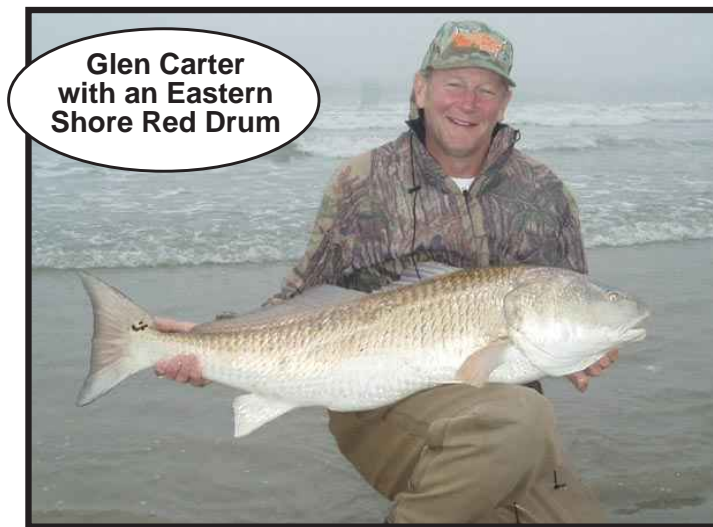
